Completing the Application

The Application is a PDF-Fillable form. Please download and save the Application to your computer to complete the form. Web browsers such as Apple Safari, Google Chrome, and Mozilla may have their own non-Adobe PDF readers set as the default reader. To use one of these browsers, change the default PDF viewer setting to Adobe Reader. If Internet Explorer is used as the browser, no action is needed.

All Users must have Adobe Acrobat Standard or Pro and Adobe Reader version 9 or higher to maximize the functionality in the form. Please be sure to enable the form, see Application Instructions for details.

The project's primary feature will be the installation of approximately 12,000 LF of sidewalk. The new sidewalk will be a minimum of 5ft in width, and concentrate on providing additional accessibility for the disabled. All intersections will be evaluated to ensure that new ramp features shall comply with PROWAG guidelines, including pavement markings and detectable surfaces as needed ROW takings may be required to meet compliance standards, primarily at some intersections to accommodate new ramps with proper grade. It is expected that existing ROW will be sufficient to install the 5ft width sidewalk along the main sidewalk thoroughfares outside of the ramp access points (Attachment F). It is expected that the increased width will be primarily to the street side impacting some trees requiring removal.

PROWAG guidelines. This project would install the necessary hardware on existing pedestrian signal poles to address this need.

The City of Batavia has made pedestrian travel a priority for the past several years. An attached map (Attachment G Page 1) shows where sidewalk improvements have occurred in an effort to provide improved travel ways to promote pedestrian transportation as an alternative to "getting in a car". These initiatives are further emphasized by the City's participation in the Genesee-Finger Lakes Regional Walkability Improvement Program (Attachment G Pages 2-11), and the Genesee County Transportation Focus Group (Attachment G Pages 12-16). This project is indicative of the City's commitment to take regional initiatives and put them into action, not just have a report on a shelf.

The City of Batavia makes every effort to try and spend monies efficiently and to have infrastructure projects make improvements that are ancillary to the primary project objective. There are two instances in this project where this innovative approach is evident. On Bank St between Washington Ave and North St only the east side of sidewalk is being replaced. This is due to the fact that the west side was replaced as part of a water main improvement project approximately five years ago where the new water main was placed under the west sidewalk so that the restoration cost, which would have been incurred regardless of the water main placement resulted in new pedestrian travel ways. On Bank St between North St and Denio St the east side sidewalks were replaced as part of a pump station project where the forcemain was placed under the sidewalk. Again, the restoration cost would have been incurred regardless of placement but this approach provided new pedestrian travel ways for the residents as a result. This approach allowed for the City to pare down the project to only one side of the street in these two sections.

The City of Batavia is committed to a successful project, and is willing to commit funds beyond the minimum 20% local share. The City Council has passed a resolution committing to fund 25% of the project cost as they feel this shows the commitment that this community has to providing pedestrian alternatives for an improved lifestyle for our residents. This 25% commitment is reflected in the project cost.
